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PUPPET CHARACTERS

LILY — a lamb
FREDDY — a frog
TUCKER — a turtle
MITZI — a little girl
VON RATTE — a rodent
MAX — a little boy

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HIDE AND SEEK

(Theme: Forgiveness)

CHARACTERS

Lily, the Lamb

Freddy, the Frog

PROPS

A cloth large enough to completely cover Lily

(Lily is sitting on stage completely covered by the cloth. Enter Freddy)

Freddy: *(Looking at cloth)* What's this? *(Cloth moves. Freddy jumps back)* Oh, my goodness, it's alive!

Lily: Sh, Freddy.

Freddy: *(Shaking all over)* It knows my name!

Lily: Be quite, Freddy. It's me.

Freddy: *(Still shaking)* Me who?

Lily: Me, Lily.

Freddy: *(Looking under cloth)* Why it IS you, Lily. You scared me! What are you doing under there?

Lily: I'm hiding. Be quite and pretend you don't know where I am.

Freddy: *(Looking around)* Where's Tucker? Are you playing hide and seek with Tucker?

Lily: No, I'm not playing with Tucker or any of our friends.

Freddy: Then who are you playing with?

Lily: No one!

Freddy: Then come out and play with me.

Lily: I can't come out. I told you I was hiding. Now go away!

Freddy: If you're not hiding from any of our friends, then who are you hiding from?

Lily: From . . . from God. Now go away!

- 1 **Freddy:** From God?! But, Lily, you can't hide from God!
2 He knows you're under there.
- 3 **Lily:** *(Coming out from under the cloth)* Did you tell
4 him, Freddy?! It wasn't nice for you to tell Him,
5 Freddy!
- 6 **Freddy:** I didn't tell Him, Lily. God always knows where we
7 are. You can't hide from God. Why would you want
8 to?
- 9 **Lily:** Last Sunday when I came to Church, I saw Tucker.
10 He was wearing this beautiful plaid coat. I felt bad
11 'cause my coat is plain. So I told him his coat looked
12 silly and he started crying. Then our Sunday School
13 teacher said God wants us to be good. I feel awful!
14 Tucker's mad at me and God's mad at me, too! I
15 just wanted to hide and now you tell me I can't hide
16 from God. What am I going to do?
- 17 **Freddy:** Well . . . you could tell God you're sorry. He loves
18 us and He won't get mad at you.
- 19 **Lily:** Hmm . . . if God isn't mad, why should I tell him
20 I'm sorry?
- 21 **Freddy:** Because God loves you, He wants you to love Him
22 back. If you do bad things but don't tell God you're
23 sorry, He'll know you don't care what He thinks.
24 God wants us to love Him and each other. When
25 we love like that, we don't want angry, unhappy
26 feelings between us.
- 27 **Lily:** How do you let God know you're sorry?
- 28 **Freddy:** You just say it. He's always listening.
- 29 **Lily:** Okay, Freddy, here goes. *(Looking up)* God, I'm
30 sorry about what I said to Tucker. I was just sad
31 because his coat is fancy and mine is plain. But
32 I'm sorry I made him feel bad. *(Looking back at*
33 *Freddy)* Are you sure that's enough, Freddy.
- 34 **Freddy:** Yup, but now we have to find Tucker so that you
35 can tell him you're sorry.
- Lily:** Do I have to?

1 **Freddy:** Sure you do. God doesn't want bad feelings
2 between you and Tucker. He loves you both.
3 **Lily:** What if Tucker stays mad?
4 **Freddy:** I don't think he will if you tell him that part about
5 how you thought his coat was nicer than yours.
6 I'll come with you if you want me to.
7 **Lily:** Oh, would you! You're a good friend, Freddy.
8 I'm glad you came by. I was tired of hiding!
9 *(Both exit)*

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HOLLERED BE THY NAME

(Theme: Prayer)

CHARACTERS

Lily, the Lamb

Tucker, the Turtle

(Skit begins with Lily on stage)

Lily: Our Father who parks in Heaven, hollered be thy name. *(Short pause)* Oh, what comes next . . . let me see . . .

(Enter Tucker)

Tucker: Hi, Lily!

Lily: Oh, Tucker, can you help me? I'm trying to learn that prayer everyone said last Sunday, and I can only get to the hollering part.

Tucker: Hollering part? I don't remember anyone yelling in Church last Sunday.

Lily: Oh, no one yelled. They just prayed that they were going to. Everyone said, "Hollered be thy name."

Tucker: They did?! That seems like a strange thing to say to God. Maybe you got the words mixed up.

Lily: I don't know. They said a lot of funny things I didn't understand. I thought you could help me. I want to learn that prayer so God will know I'm here.

Tucker: My Sunday School teacher says God always knows where we are and that He's the best friend we've got. Praying is just talking to God.

Lily: What are you supposed to say? I don't want to say something He doesn't want to hear. That's why I wanted to learn the prayer that everyone says.

Tucker: Maybe we'll learn that prayer later. But if God's our friend . . . why, we could just say the things

1 Tucker: (*Contd*) we'd like to say to our best friend! I don't
 2 think we'd have to say something special or say
 3 it in some special way.

4 Lily: Are you sure?

5 Tucker: Well, I think so. They say a lot of prayers in Church,
 6 not just that one about the hollering. Mostly they
 7 say a lot of thank yous. I gotta go, Lily. Freddy is
 8 going to teach me to frog kick. Bye now.
 9 (*He exits*)

10 Lily: (*Long pause . . . Calling*) Tucker! Tucker, come
 11 back! You forgot to tell me how to start. Oh,
 12 shucks, he's gone. (*Pause. Looking up*) Hi, God.
 13 (*Waves. In a bit of a rush*) My name is Lily and
 14 I'm a lamb and I live at (*Address of your Church*)
 15 and if I'm starting wrong, it's because Tucker left
 16 before I could ask him how. But he said praying
 17 was just like talking and that you're my best friend.
 18 (*Pause*) It's exciting to have a friend who always
 19 knows where I am and always has time to listen.
 20 In Sunday School, I'm learning about all the nice
 21 things you do and all about the beautiful things
 22 you made for us to enjoy. And I'd like to say thank
 23 you. You must be very good! (*Short pause*) Oh,
 24 I'd like to tell you about my swimming lessons.
 25 They're really fun! At first I was afraid to put my
 26 face in the water. It was really scary! But my
 27 teacher is such a nice lady. She didn't mind that
 28 I was afraid. She didn't yell at me or push me
 29 under! Now I can even put my nose in the water
 30 and I'm not scared at all. (*Short pause*) I'm glad
 31 you don't mind if I can't remember the words
 32 to a special prayer. I'm glad you love me and
 33 that you love my friends, too. (*Short pause*)
 34 I guess that's all I want to say this time. (*Starts*
 35 *exiting slowly, then stops*) Oh! (*Hurries back to*
original position) When I can understand better,
 I'll probably want to holler your name, too. (*Exits*)

MIRROR, MIRROR

(Theme: Self-acceptance)

CHARACTERS

Freddy, the Frog
Tucker, the Turtle
Lily, the Lamb
Mitzi, the little girl

PROPS

A mirror attached to the stage

- Freddy:** (*Pops onto the stage*) Hey, kids! I've got this neat joke I'm going to play on my friends, hee, hee. You see this mirror, hee, hee? I'm going to tell them that this mirror, hee, hee, is magic, hee, hee. A magic mirror — get it, hee, hee? It's just an old mirror my mom said I could play with. But my silly friends won't know that, hee, hee. I'll bet they get so excited, excited, hee, hee. Oh, I see Lily coming. (*Calling*) Lily, hey Lily! Come look at what I've got.
- Lily:** (*Appearing on stage*) Hi, Freddy. What do you have? Let me see.
- Freddy:** Do you see this mirror?
- Lily:** (*Hesitantly*) Yes . . . I see your mirror.
- Freddy:** Well, this isn't just an ordinary mirror. This is a magic mirror!
- Lily:** A magic mirror?! How does it work?
- Freddy:** Oh . . . it's one of those "mirror, mirror on the wall" type magic mirrors. Go ahead and try it, hee, hee.
- Lily:** Well, if you think it's all right. Here goes: "Mirror, mirror on the wall Who's the loveliest lamb of them all?" (*Long Pause*) Freddy, nothing happened.
- Freddy:** Well, try it again, hee, hee.
- Lily:** Mirror, mirror on the wall. Who's the loveliest

- 1 Lily: (*Contd*) lamb of all? (*Pause*) It still didn't work.
 2 What's wrong with it, Freddy?
 3 Freddy: Hee, hee! Maybe you're too ugly, hee, hee.
 4 Lily: Oh, no! I'm ugly! (*Starts crying*)
 5 Freddy: Oh, oh. Now I'm in trouble! (*Pops off stage*)
 6 (*Tucker comes on stage*)
 7 Tucker: Lily, why are you crying?
 8 Lily: Boo, hoo! You see that mirror? It's magic and I'm
 9 so ugly it won't even talk to me. Boo, hoo!
 10 Tucker: A magic mirror?! (*Looks it over*) Maybe I'll try it.
 11 Mirror, mirror on the wall. Who's the most terrific
 12 turtle of all?
 13 (*Lily stops crying and she and Tucker watch the*
 14 *mirror expectantly*)
 15 Lily: Boo, hoo. It didn't work for you either. Boo, hoo.
 16 We're both ugly! Boo, hoo.
 17 (*Tucker snaps his head into his shell and lily's crying*
 18 *gets louder. Mitzi comes on stage*)
 19 Mitzi: What's wrong? Oh my, what's wrong? Lily, stop
 20 crying. (*Looking into Tucker's shell*) Tucker, come
 21 out. Lily, please tell me what's wrong.
 22 Lily: You see that mirror, sniff, sniff? It's a magic mirror
 23 and — sniff, sniff — Tucker and I are so ugly it won't
 24 even talk to us!
 25 Mitzi: Lily, that's not a magic mirror — there's no such
 26 thing. That's all pretend. That mirror can't see
 27 anything. It's not alive, it doesn't have a voice.
 28 Lily: Really?
 29 Tucker: (*Peeping out*) Really?
 30 Mitzi: Of course! And you're not ugly! I've been to Sunday
 31 School and I learned that God made each of us and
 32 He made us just the way He wanted us to be. We
 33 may each look different, but each of us is beautiful
 34 in God's eyes.
 35 Tucker: You mean God thinks I'm beautiful?

1 Mitzi: Oh, yes!
2 Lily: And He thinks I'm beautiful, too?
3 Mitzi: Of course! I want you to remember that next time
4 you look in to a mirror. When you look in a mirror,
5 you see what you REALLY look like. And you can
6 say to yourself, "I'm beautiful because I look just
7 like God wants me to look."
8 Lily: Oh, we'd better go tell Freddy, cause he still thinks
9 this mirror is magic!
10 Tucker: And we can tell him God thinks he's beautiful.
11 *(All depart)*
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TUG OF WAR

(Theme: Working Together)

CHARACTERS

Lily, the Lamb

Freddy, the Frog

Tucker, the Turtle

PROPS

A rope, one end safety-pinned to Lily's hand, running through a hook at far end of the stage (To keep it (above eye level of the stage) and the other end disappearing behind the stage.

Suggestions: Have Lily positioned at the end of the stage farthest from hook. Tucker should be next to her — also facing hook. Since our Tucker puppet has no hands, he needs to hold the rope in his mouth.

But since he needs to let go of it to "talk", Lily will still be able to "hold the rope up." Pulling the Lily puppet one way will move the rope in that direction.

One of the puppeteers behind the stage can pull the other end (Hanging off stage) when rope is pulled by Freddy.

(Tucker and Lily begin action by pulling on the rope)

Lily: Pull harder, Tucker.

Tucker: I'm pulling as hard as I can.

Lily: Try holding the rope higher.

Tucker: *(Groaning)* It hurts my neck when I do that, Lily.

Lily: *(With disappointment)* I don't think you and I can do it alone.

Tucker: *(Letting go of the rope)* No, we're not strong enough. What are we going to do?

Lily: *(In a disappointed voice)* We're just going to have Freddy come to help us.

- 1 Tucker: *(Also disappointed)* Are you sure we can't manage
 2 by ourselves? I was hoping we could do it without
 3 him.
- 4 Lily: I know how you feel, but we need help and he is the
 5 only one I can think of.
- 6 Tucker: Oh, okay. *(Calling)* Freddy, Freddy!
 7 *(Freddy pops on stage)*
- 8 Freddy: Hi, whatcha doin? Can I do it, too?
- 9 Lily: Yes, that's why we called you.
- 10 Freddy: *(Looks at rope)* Oh, boy! *(Takes rope and begins*
 11 *pulling in wrong direction — Tug of war fashion)*
 12 Hey, this is fun!
- 13 Tucker: No, you're pulling the wrong way! We need your
 14 help.
- 15 Freddy: *(Still pulling against them)* I like my game better.
 16 This is a lot more fun. Whee!
- 17 Lily: *(With some anger)* Freddy, you stop that! Stop
 18 that right now! It's not funny!
- 19 Freddy: *(Still pulling)* It is too fun! I'm going to pull you
 20 both over so you'd better hang on tight!
- 21 Lily: We're not playing a game so stop it!
- 22 Freddy: *(Dropping hand so it no longer looks like he's pulling)*
 23 You two never do anything that's fun. This is a
 24 neat game and you're just mad cause I thought of
 25 it first.
- 26 Tucker: We're not mad, Freddy. It's just that we don't
 27 want to play a game now. We've got something
 28 important to do.
- 29 Lily: That's right. This is really important. So, please help
 30 us.
- 31 Freddy: I don't want to work. I want to play. You two are
 32 no fun at all.
 33 *(Freddy leaves)*
- 34 Tucker: Well, I guess we'll just have to give up.
- 35 Lily: Yeh, you're right. Oh, I wish Freddy would have

1 Lily: (Contd) cooperated. We could have done it if he
2 would have helped.
3 Tucker: We should have known he wouldn't. He thinks it's
4 more fun to do what he wants to do.
5 Lily: Maybe we should have told him.
6 Tucker: But that would have spoiled the surprise!
7 Lily: Well, it's spoiled now anyway.
8 Tucker: Yeh, it sure is.
9 Lily: Maybe he would have helped if he knew there was
10 a gift for HIM on the other end of this rope. Now
11 he'll never get it.
12 Tucker: (Sadly) Maybe someday he'll learn we have to work
13 together for good things.
14 Lily: Maybe — I sure hope so.
15 (Tucker and Lily leave stage)
16 (If the person backstage lets go of the tension on the
17 hidden end of the rope, Lily should be able to leave
18 the stage. As soon as she's hidden, the safety pin
19 holding the rope can be unfastened)
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THE TERRIBLE DAY

(Theme: Dealing with Frustration)

CHARACTERS

Freddy, the Frog

Lily, the Lamb

Von Ratte, the Rodent

PROPS

A very badly tied bow tie around Freddy's neck

(Enter Freddy)

Freddy: It's been a terrible day. It's been a terrible, rotten day! It's been a terrible, rotten, lousy day! It's been . . .

Von *(Von Ratte pops on stage)*

Ratte: What's dis? Did I hear somevun say it's been a bad day?

Freddy: Yes, I said it's been a bad day. In fact, it's been a terrible, rotten, lousy day!

Ratte: Und vhy, my little friend, do you say this?

Freddy: Nothing's gone right today. I fell out of bed this morning, my toothbrush broke, I couldn't find my library book, my best friend couldn't come over to play, and now I can't get this tie tied.

Ratte: Tsk, tsk. Und I say, vhy should my little froggy friend half to half such a terrible day? No vunder you're so upset. So vould anyvun be.

(Enter Lily)

Lily: Hi, Freddy. It's nice to see you. How are you?

Ratte: Ah, my little beauty, you shouldn't ask.

Lily: Why, is something wrong?

Freddy: Yes, something's wrong! Everything's wrong! Everything!

Ratte: See, I told you not to ask.

- 1 **Lily:** Is there something I can do, Freddy?
- 2 **Freddy:** No, no one can help.
- 3 **Lily:** Whatever is wrong?
- 4 **Freddy:** I just can't do anything right today.
- 5 **Lily:** Oh, Freddy, we all have days like that.
- 6 **Ratte:** Let the little fellow enjoy being miserable.
- 7 **Freddy:** No one knows how I feel.
- 8 **Lily:** God knows, Freddy.
- 9 **Freddy:** What's He going to do about it then?
- 10 **Lily:** He's already done something.
- 11 **Ratte:** Like what?
- 12 **Lily:** Well, He made this beautiful world for us to live in.
- 13 No matter how bad we feel, if we just look around
- 14 we'll see something beautiful put there by God for
- 15 us to enjoy.
- 16 **Freddy:** You mean God knew I'd feel bad today?
- 17 **Lily:** He knew we'd all have days when we were unhappy
- 18 with ourselves. So He made a special place for us to
- 19 live full of good things to make us feel better.
- 20 **Freddy:** Where are these good things that will make me feel
- 21 better?
- 22 **Lily:** C'mon, let's take a walk. We'll make a list of every
- 23 nice thing we see. I know you'll feel better.
- 24 *(Lily and Freddy exit)*
- 25 **Ratte:** *(To the children)* Rats, foiled again!
- 26 *(Von Ratte exits)*
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THE RUN AWAY

(Theme: Facing Problems)

CHARACTERS

Mitzi, the girl puppet

Max, the boy puppet

PROPS

A small suitcase that can be attached to Mitzi's arm

(Mitzi walks across the stage "carrying" the suitcase.

Max comes on stage and sees her)

Max: Hi, Mitzi. I've been looking all over for you. I want you to come and play a new game at my house.

Mitzi: *(Starting to cry)* Boo, hoo. Sniff, sniff. *(In a tearful voice)* Don't mention games to me, Max. I never want to play another game in my life! Sniff, sniff.

Max: What did I say? Stop crying, Mitzi. I'll even let you win!

Mitzi: Oh, Max. I don't mind if I lose. It's not that. It's just that . . .sniff . . .I'm in trouble for not picking up my game at home. I hate trying to get all those pieces in the box.

Max: Me, too. I just hate that!

Mitzi: But my mommy's mad at me — real mad. *(Cries again)*

Max: *(Patting Mitzi)* Gee, that's too bad, Mitzi. Please don't cry. Maybe it would help if you told your mommy that you're sorry.

Mitzi: I can't now.

Max: Why not? Did she go somewhere?

Mitzi: No, it's me. See this suitcase? I'm running away from home.

Max: Where will you go?

Mitzi: I don't know. It has to be somewhere close 'cause

- 1 Mitzi: (*Contd*) I'm not allowed to cross the street.
 2 Max: You could come to my house.
 3 Mitzi: (*Happily*) Oh, could I, Max?
 4 Max: Sure, but . . .well, I bet my mom would make you
 5 pick up, too. She makes me.
 6 Mitzi: Then where can I go?
 7 Max: Maybe you ought to go home, Mitzi! I bet there's
 8 not one place in the whole world where you can
 9 leave your toys out.
 10 Mitzi: When I grow up, I'm not going to do anything I
 11 don't want to.
 12 Max: Somehow I get the feeling that even grown ups have
 13 to do things they don't want to do . . . sometimes.
 14 Mitzi: Do you mean that I'm going to spend the rest of my
 15 life doing things I don't want to do?!
- 16 Max: Oh, no! Just maybe sometimes. When that does
 17 happen, it's better to just do your best and not make
 18 a fuss. Then it doesn't make so many problems.
 19 Mitzi: I guess I'll go home and unpack my suitcase.
 20 Max: Whatcha got in the suitcase?
 21 Mitzi: Why, my game, of course. It's my favorite one —
 22 I wouldn't leave it behind.
 23 (*They begin to depart from the stage. Max stops*)
 24 Max: (*Questioningly*) Mitzi, if you could put the game
 25 in your suitcase, how come you couldn't put it in
 26 the box?
 27 (*They finish departing*)
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THE GIFT EXCHANGE

(Theme: The Christmas Season)

CHARACTERS

Mitzi, the little girl puppet

Max, the little boy puppet

PROPS

A wrapped Christmas gift attached to the stage

(Enter Max)

Max: *(Speaking to the children)* You see this present?
It's something I made in Sunday School. And I'm
going to give it to Mitzi for Christmas. Boy, will
she be surprised. *(Turns and calls down)* Mitzi,
Mitzi! Where are you?

(Enter Mitzi)

Mitzi: Here I am. What is it? *(Spots gift)* Oh, a present!
Who does it belong to?

Max: Guess!

Mitzi: Does it belong to you, Max?

Max: Well, kinda. I made it and wrapped it and now I'm
going to give it to someone I like.

Mitzi: Is it for Mommy?

Max: Nope.

Mitzi: Is it for Daddy?

Max: Nope. I'll give you a hint — it's for my very best
friend.

Mitzi: Hmm . . . you mean Johnny?

Max: No, Silly, it's for you 'cause you're my very best
friend.

Mitzi: Oh, Max, can I open it now? *(She touches present)*

Max: No! It's a Christmas present and you have to wait
for Christmas.

Mitzi: Max, why does everyone get so excited about

- 1 Mitzi: *(Contd)* Christmas? Why is Christmas so special?
- 2 Max: Oh, Mitzi, I thought everyone knew that! Christmas
- 3 is special because it's Jesus' birthday.
- 4 Mitzi: Oh no! Oh, goodness gracious!!
- 5 Max: *(Patting Mitzi)* What's wrong?
- 6 Mitzi: Well, we've got gifts under our tree for everyone . . .
- 7 everyone except Jesus. And it's the person who's
- 8 having the birthday that's supposed to get the
- 9 presents. How can I get a gift to Jesus? Maybe
- 10 our Sunday School teacher knows His address?!
- 11 *(Mitzi starts to leave)*
- 12 Max: No, wait! Mom and dad told me about this last year.
- 13 They put some money in an envelope and I asked
- 14 why. They said it was their gift to Jesus.
- 15 Mitzi: Did they put a stamp on it?
- 16 Max: No, they put it in the offering at Church
- 17 Mitzi: Did the Church send it to Jesus?
- 18 Max: No. Dad said the money would go to help people
- 19 who need help.
- 20 Mitzi: Then that's not something for Jesus!
- 21 Max: Oh, yes it is! I asked my Dad. He told me Jesus
- 22 said that everytime we do something nice for
- 23 someone else it's just like we did it for Him. Our
- 24 gifts to Jesus are the nice things we do for other
- 25 people.
- 26 Mitzi: I didn't know good deeds were our gifts to Jesus.
- 27 I do know I feel good inside when I do something
- 28 nice.
- 29 Max: *(After short pause)* Hey, maybe the way we feel
- 30 inside is Jesus' gift to us. Let's go ask our Sunday
- 31 School teacher.
- 32 *(They both exit)*
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MOVING ON

(Theme: Dealing with Loss — Easter Season)

CHARACTERS

Lily, the Lamb

Tucker, the Turtle

(Lily comes on stage shouting . . .)

Lily: Hooray! Hooray! Hooray!

(Tucker enters)

Tucker: Hi, Lily. Boy, you seem happy.

Lily: Oh, I am! I am!

Tucker: How come?

Lily: I got to go visit our friend Dan in *(Name of nearby town)*. I got to see his new house and everything.

Tucker: Was he sick and sad?

Lily: Why, no. He was very happy. And he's got lots of nice new friends.

Tucker: *(In a sad voice)* He's probably forgotten all about us.

Lily: Oh, no! Dan wouldn't forget us.

Tucker: I bet he's forgotten me.

Lily: No, he hasn't. Goodness, Tucker, I thought you'd be glad to hear Dan is happy and has new friends.

Tucker: If he really loved me, he wouldn't want any new friends.

Lily: Oh, Tucker, if you really loved Dan, you'd want him to be happy. We can have new friends and still love our old friends, too.

Tucker: I guess you're right. Lily, don't tell anyone . . . but I . . . I cried when he left.

Lily: Oh, I cried, too.

Tucker: Aren't you ashamed? What if people think you're a crybaby?

Lily: No one will think that. It's not wrong to cry when

- 1 Lily: (*Contd*) you're sad.
 2 Tucker: Are you sure?
 3 Lily: Of course, I'm sure. The Bible said Jesus cried
 4 when He was sad.
 5 Tucker: Why did He cry?
 6 Lily: Well . . . He cried twice when He heard that friends
 7 of His were gone. And He cried when He knew He'd
 8 have to leave His friends.
 9 Tucker: Why do people have to leave? Why can't we stay
 10 together all the time?
 11 Lily: There are lots of reasons why people leave. But
 12 new people come, too. Some of my favorite
 13 people are here because they had to leave someplace
 14 else. Why, if they hadn't come, I never would have
 15 met them.
 16 Tucker: Yeh . . .yeh, that's true.
 17 Lily: Now c'mon. Let's go to my house and write a letter
 18 to Dan.
 19 Tucker: I'm going to send my picture. Then even if he wants
 20 to forget, he won't be able to.
